

14 notification boxes created with CSS. Only one CSS file is required to setup the required notifications.

- 100% CSS based
- No images/pictures except Notification icons of size 32x32
- 14 different notification boxes with appropriate notification icon
- Easy to setup. You can change the color, icon, text or other settings with three separate CSS for NOTIFICATION.

CSS FILES:

- Large.css ← Use for Large Notification
- Small.css ← Use for Small Notification
- Medium.CSS ← Use for Medium Notification

SETUP

- Upload the CSS files and the images folder to your website.
By default the images folder require the same folder as the CSS,
But you can change it by going into the CSS file and then changing the image path (directory) for the icons.
- Use DIV tag to your page with a class of an existing CSS class. Such as

```
<div class="success"></div>
```

It will display the success notification box.

- For notification Title, add a h4 heading tag (or any required tag) and paragraph (tag) as the notification description. For example

```
<div class="success">
  <h4>Title</h4>
  <p>Description of the notification</p>
</div>
```

This will bring the notification box having title as Success of heading size h4 defined in CSS file, Icon and Description of the box.

IMPORTANT:

We define H4 and P tags for EACH notification in CSS, You don't need to worry your Website layout will not change, you could directly import CSS file as per your requirements.

EXAMPLE:

```
.success{ ← Success Notification Setting area (COLOR/Border Colors/Images)
  border-color: #0e7fad;
  color:#4f8746;
  background:#d4ffcd url('images/success.png') no-repeat;
  background-position:30px 20px;}
```

```
.success h4{ ← Specific Different <h4> Tags for Every Notification CSS for Color/Size
  margin:5px 5px 5px 80px;padding:0; font-size:18px;
}
```

```
.success p{ ← Specific Different <p> Tags for Every Notification CSS for Color/Size
  font-size:14px;
  color:#434E54;
  margin:5px 5px 5px 80px;}
```

NOTE: Please remember that only webkit browsers fully support CSS3 transitions and IE still doesn't support CSS3
